Identify the truth behind common university myths.

Skills

Practice critical thinking and public speaking through group discussions and presentations.

Reflection

Reflect on changing perceptions about university options.

Common University Myths



Myth 1: University isn't for people like me

This myth often stems from societal biases and a lack of understanding about the diverse range of university programs and support systems available.



Myth 2: I need to go to a prestigious University to be successful

Success is defined by individual effort and skills, not by the reputation of the university attended.



Myth 3: The 'right' course will determine my career success

Career paths are often non-linear, and a specific course doesn't guarantee a particular career outcome. Adaptability and continuous learning are key.

Myth-Busting Group Activity

Outcome

Practice critical thinking and public speaking by discussing myths and presenting evidence.

Group Task

Divide into small groups, and each group is assigned one myth to challenge

Resources

Use the "Myth-Busting Fact Sheet" with data and statistics

Presentation

Discuss the myth and prepare a short presentation explaining why it is incorrect

Present Findings and Discussion



Group Presentations

Each group presents their findings (3-4 minutes per group)



Discussion Prompt

Questions and feedback after each group's presentation.



Quiz

Myth or Fact?



Objective:

Reinforce understanding of myths vs facts



Activity: Conduct a quiz ask students to determine if statements are 'Myth' or 'Fact'



Examples:

"Many successful people graduated from lesser-known universities." (Fact)

"You need perfect grades to get into any university." (Myth)

Wrap-Up and Reflections

Outcome: Reflect on how your perception of university options has changed

Activity: Write down one myth you previously believed and what evidence changed your view.

Follow-up: Share what you learned with peers or family members.
