LESSON PLAN 2:

Group Activities

Students engage in interactive exercises that use factual information to dispel myths and encourage critical thinking about higher education options.

Use the "Myth-Busting Fact Sheets" to provide solid data that challenges misconceptions and encourages informed thinking.

These resources are crucial for backing up discussions with reliable information.

LESSON PLAN 3:

Students engage with realistic scenarios, such as choosing between university and an apprenticeship, to practice decision-making skills.

Personal Reflection

Activities focus on key factors like location, cost, and course content, encouraging students to reflect on their personal preferences and priorities.

Adviser Tip

Encourage honest reflection to help students identify their true preferences and goals. This self-awareness is crucial for making well-informed decisions about their future.



Engaging Students Effectively



Use Interactive Tools

Implement platforms like Kahoot for quizzes to make learning more engaging and interactive.



Encourage Group Work

Make discussions relevant by tying them to real-world examples, fostering collaboration and peer learning.



Foster Personal Reflection

Use activity sheets to prompt individual thought on personal goals, encouraging self-awareness and introspection.



Accessibility and Inclusion

Visual Accessibility

Use large, readable fonts and high-contrast colours in all presentation materials and handouts to ensure visibility for all students.

2 Alternative Formats

Provide alt text for visuals and offer alternative formats for activity sheets if needed, catering to different learning styles and abilities.

Inclusive Participation

Ensure that all students can participate fully, regardless of learning style or ability, by offering diverse ways to engage with the material.

Reflection and Evaluation for Career Advisers

Open Discussion

Discuss openly what students enjoyed or found challenging about the lessons to gather valuable feedback.

Continuous Improvement

Use the insights gained from reflection and student feedback to refine teaching approaches and better meet student needs in future sessions.
